

Due to the complexity of lesson scheduling, students in Years 7-10 **may not** receive face-to-face teaching from their regular class teacher. Classes will be divided into separate rooms depending on the number of students who attend and the size of the room. Rolls will be marked during all periods




# Are the buses running?


# Will the canteen be open?

Yes. However, while bottled water and fruit juice will be available there is a limited food menu.



**Menu includes:** Hot Chicken Caesar Turkish, Chicken Burger, Sweet Chilli Tender Roll or Burger, Sweet Chilli Chicken Caesar Salad Box, Beef Pie, Butter Chicken & Rice, Watermelon bowls, Potato Wedges.

# How will I know what rooms to go to?

You will follow an adjusted timetable and only go to the rooms you have been allocated.



# Will I have my regular teacher?

Due to social distancing requirements, your lesson may not always be delivered by your regular classroom teacher. Classes will have limited number of students and teaching staff will be split across these smaller class groupings.



# I'm in Year 12, How do I meet with my teachers?

On non-scheduled days, Year 12 students can attend pre-arranged workshops tutorials or make appointments with their teachers to use facilities or to borrow equipment. All students must **sign in and out**, electronically, at the main administration office.




# Do Year 12 students still have study periods?

You will have study periods on your timetabled day. The library will be open to catch up on work and to complete assessment tasks. Social distancing measures will apply at **ALL** times.

# What will lunchtime and recess look like?

Limited playground areas will be available. Students will be required to social distance. Students will not be permitted to share sporting equipment.



As mentioned earlier, the canteen will be open, however a limited menu will be offered. Students will be required to follow social distancing markings on the ground in the canteen areas. **Do not share drinks or food** – school bubblers will **NOT** be operational. Water bottles can be refilled at the **WATER FOUNTAINS** located in A Block and E Block.

# Will the Library be open?

The library will not be open for students during lunch and recess. Only year 12 students will have access to the library during their study periods.



# Can I attend if I am unwell?

No. If you are unwell, stay home. If you come to school and are unwell, your parents, carers and emergency contacts will be called to collect you. If you are unwell during the school day, you will not be able to remain in the clinic. Your parents will be expected to collect you from school if you are unwell. It would be appreciated if as an additional precaution, your parents could check your temperature before leaving home.



# What is happening with online learning during phase 1?

On **non-timetabled days (at home)**, **ONLINE LESSONS** utilising Google classroom activities or learning booklets will continue. You should follow your **regular timetable**, but you will end the school day at the 12.55pm (Mondays) and 1.30pm (Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday). In the afternoon you are able to determine your own learning needs. Some suggested activities for you to do include:

### Years 7 to 10

- -Reading: a minimum of 20 minutes
- -Wordflyers
- -Longer term assignments
- -Class activities not completed from the morning
- -Extension work as provided or of your own design.

### Years 11 to 12

- -Assignments
- -Edrolo
- -Class activities not finished from morning lessons
- -Additional work set by the teacher
- -Additional contact with the teacher as arranged to assist in major works
- -Self-directed learning subject reading, note taking, summaries, revision, memorising and practice papers.

# What happens if my family decide it is best for me to stay home?

You will be expected to attend school on your allocated school day, unless you are unwell. No online work will be provided on that day. Students not in attendance on their scheduled day at school should continue with the existing work provided on Google Classroom or in the work packages provided.



# When will school return to normal?

We're not sure how long Phase 1 will continue for, but we will let you know as soon as we can! We are forward planning in preparation for the next phase or to be moved back into Phase 0. See the appendix for each phase.



# What is happening with assessments?

### General Advice on School Base Assessments: Year 7-12

- Assessment tasks scheduled in Term 2 and 3 will go ahead as planned (refer to Year 7-12 Assessment Procedures and Policy).
- Following NESA guidelines, students will be provided with adequate written notice of any changes in assessment tasks or scheduling.



### **Year 12 Assessment Schedules**

- Clearly marked *Revised HSC Assessment schedule* will be distributed to, and signed by students, Week 4, Term 2.
- Amended HSC assessment schedules may include assessment tasks which contain exam style conditions during in class assessment tasks.

### **Practical Lessons**

- Year 12 students will be participating in practical lessons, including VET and subjects involving major projects/works. Teachers will determine if there is a need to swap theory and practical lessons within a timetabled lesson. Further advice regarding cleaning of practical equipment will be provided by teachers of each subject area.
- Year 12 students on non-timetabled days can attend pre-arranged workshops/tutorials or make appointments with their teachers to use facilities or to borrow equipment. All students must sign - in and sign - out electronically, at the main administration office.
- Students in Years 7-11 may participate in practical lessons, this includes electives. This will be a faculty based decision.

### **HSC Projects, Body of Works and Performances**

As per NESA Advice, Head Teachers will provide information about in-school marking processes for Visual Arts, Industrial Technology and Design and Technology. The due dates for externally marked Society and Culture Personal Interest Projects and Music submitted works remain unchanged.

# **2020 VET Mandatory Work Placement**

Students are **no longer** required to undertake NESA-mandated VET work placements.
