Term 3 in Review

As a school, our ultimate goal is to provide a holistic, relevant and significant education not only through developing new knowledge in the classroom, but also through extra-curricular activities. However, while extra-curricular activities are considered to be an integral part of school life it has not been possible, due to health and safety restrictions, for many activities to take place on site during last semester and this term.

Nonetheless, with our teachers very much aware of the benefits of student involvement in these activities they have worked creatively with many of our community partners to deliver learning through on - line platforms.

With the emergence of the "new normal", the Australian Business and Community Network or ABCN adopted on - line learning to deliver the Focus Program and Digital Focus Pilot Program. These programs are about building on existing leadership skills to engage young women in successful and meaningful career pathways. In talking to Ms Porter, the Girls Education Co-ordinator, she said "it was fantastic and wonderful to watch the girls develop in confidence and willingly offer their opinions to gain a better understanding of their leadership potential and to build on their creative and problem-solving skills during the on-line discussions with their Microsoft mentors".

In developing public speaking skills, Mr Nugent was very happy to announce this term the re-launch of the school's Debating Club and the participation of year 7/8 in this year's Premier's Debating Challenge consisting of three on-line round-robin debates. In the first two rounds against East Hills Boys and Prairiewood High Schools the students displayed well-honed public speaking skills and are growing in confidence.

On-line workshops delivered by Elevate Education also assisted Year 11 students improve their study techniques to build confidence and increase motivation to lift their performance in the end of preliminary course examinations they are currently undertaking.

In unlocking the potential in every student, the ULTIMO Vocational Education and Training Awards streamed live in week 9 was a celebration of the dedication of students, parents, teachers, schools and community partners who have contributed to vocational education and training. With over 10,000 students enrolled in VET courses across Sydney South West, I would like to congratulate Ghabriel Arbash of Year 12 as an award winner who demonstrated excellence, commitment and passion in his VET area of study – Retail.

TAFE's youth engagement strategy has also helped Miller students realise post school career options. Congratulations and well done to the following Year 10 students on successfully completing this terms program - Abed Alajia, Mena Alsalihi, Rishithan Arulselvam, Kaizar Hamoo, Cedra Ali, Carlos Khieophiu and Malachi Mumbler.

Over the past term, other programs including SPARC, Peer Support, MTC's Youth Frontiers and Links to Learning, Full Steam Ahead and the Western Sydney University's Fast Forward Program have definitely placed students at the centre of their learning by empowering them with the practical skills and strategies to positively navigate life and relations to achieve more than they thought possible.

Graduation and Formal Update

Much to the cheers of Year 12, on Friday 11 September, NSW Health released COVID-19 Safety Plans which permit Year 12 formals and graduations at the conclusion of the HSC exams, Thursday 12 November 2020. Given the current advice, our Year 12 graduation ceremony is scheduled for Wednesday 18 November and the formal for Friday 20 November. Further information will be provided early next term about family attendance once our COVID - 19 Safety Plans are finalised.

2020 HSC Examinations - Parent Advice

We know our students and staff have worked hard for the HSC. The safety of our students and staff remains of utmost importance.

This year extra arrangements are in place to ensure that any disruption due to COVID-19 will have minimal impact on HSC exams.

Our school has put in place a number of contingencies to help ensure exams run as smoothly as possible. The exams have been scheduled and our school has arrangements in place for exams to proceed as planned.

It is important that students review their timetable and plan well so they turn up for their exams on time, healthy and rested. Any student with a pre-existing condition, that presents similarly to flu-like symptoms, should be planning now and speak to their doctor/GP. The GP can provide a medical certificate ahead of the exams to ensure they are not sent home.

If on the day of the exam your child feels unwell with flu-like symptoms, they should stay home and get tested. HSC students are prioritised for COVID-19 test results.

It's important to note that all students will be asked if they are well before entering exam rooms. We want all our students to sit their exams, but sometimes things happen. If your child is unwell and misses their exam, contact the school. Students who are unwell will be eligible for the illness and misadventure provision with NESA.

If there are any changes to exam arrangements we will communicate with HSC students through the School and Year 12 Facebook sites and the school webpage. These will be the only source of communication for these types of notifications. If in doubt, please call the school. We wish all our students well in the upcoming exams.

In a closing comment, I firmly believe that during this term the quality of classroom practice observed, and the many extra - curricular opportunities provided, have certainly focused our school's vision of 'Promoting Growth and Development' of students in many ways.

With the spring vacation upon us, I would like to wish staff, students and their families a safe and relaxing break and leave you with a thought to reflect upon by Dr Meredith Grey from the Iconic United States Medical Drama, Grey's Anatomy about 'change'. She said:

"Change; we don't like it, we fear it, but we can't stop it from coming. We either adapt to change, or we will be left behind."

Again, a reminder to all students that school returns – Monday 12 October, 2020.













YEAR 12 VISUAL ART EXHIBITION - HSC MAJOR WORKS
