Public Speaking

For the first time this year, public speaking has been implemented into the Year 8 English program and supported by our newly furnished public speaking room, E16. The Online Enrolment System is designed to provide flexibility for our parents to submit an enrolment application online and at the time that best suits you. The application can be accessed on all browsers and mobile devices including iOS and Android.

The online application process is currently restricted to:

- Enrolments into local schools only
- Children who are Australian citizens, New Zealand citizens or permanent residents
- Children who live in NSW.

We offer our support and encourage you to complete your application to enrol online. If, however, you do not feel comfortable completing an application online, a paper copy will be available for collection from the front office or can be downloaded from the Department's <u>going to a public</u> <u>school site</u>.

WOMENS GROUP

The Women's Group program is a community engagement program at Miller Technology High School, which began in 2017 in partnership with Liverpool Health Women's Centre. The program aims to support new arrival families, especially those from a refugee background, in their settlement process and develop connections between the community and the school.

Within this program, different sessions are catered for women to support them in their everyday functioning in the community with community organisations, teachers and SLSO in collaboration with the Community Liaison Officer at our school. We had more than 25 parents who formed parts of this program and came into school once a week participating in Community Kitchen, Computer Course, English Classes and educational excursions. During the COVID crisis in 2020, this program could not function to its full capacity because of the restrictions. Every effort was made to stay connected with all participants via emails and phone calls. All the women expressed that they were eager and desperate to come back to our school to continue with the Women's Group program.

The success of this program surpassed all expectations. Our school community has every intention to continue to improve opportunities for parents to be active participants in our school and the wider community. They will support them and their children to embrace their new life in Australia by making them feel safe and welcomed.
